Communion

Christians of all denominations are invited to receive Communion. Sidespeople will direct you to a place at the altar rail - those in the side aisle pews come forward first. Our bishops have requested that the practice of intinction (dipping the Communion wafer into the wine) be discontinued as unhygienic. If we receive in one kind (i.e. Communion wafer only or wine only) we have received the sacrament in full.
