Gospel **Mark 1:29-39**

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told Jesus about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. That evening, at sundown, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." He answered, "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

**We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.**

**For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.**

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People **Amen.**

Celebrant God of compassion and forgiveness,

All **receive our offering this day,**

**and make us one with him who is our peace,  
Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.**

### **The Great Thanksgiving**

Celebrant The Lord be with you.  
**All And also with you.**  
Celebrant Lift up your hearts.  
**All We lift them to the Lord.**  
Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**All It is right to give our thanks and praise.**  
Celebrant It is right to give you thanks and praise, O Lord, our God, sustainer of the universe, you are  
worthy of glory and praise.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns,  
the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home; by your will they were created and  
have their being.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory,  
reason, and skill; you made us the stewards of creation.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant But we turn against you, and betray your trust; and we turn against one another. Again and  
again you call us to return. Through the prophets and sages you reveal your righteous law. In the  
fullness of time you sent your Son, born of a woman, to be our Saviour. He was wounded for our  
transgressions, and bruised for our iniquities. By his death he opened to us the way of freedom  
and peace.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant Therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles,  
and martyrs, and with those in every generation  
who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory,  
in their unending hymn:  
**All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Proulx**  
**heaven and earth are full of your glory.**  
**Hosanna in the highest.**  
**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**  
**Hosanna in the highest.**  
Celebrant Blessed are you, Lord our God, for sending us Jesus, the Christ, who on the night he was  
handed over to suffering and death, took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, gave it to his friends, and  
said, "Take this, and eat it: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the  
remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper, he took the cup of wine; he gave you thanks, and  
said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the  
forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant Gracious God, we recall the death of your Son Jesus Christ, we proclaim his resurrection and  
ascension, and we look with expectation for his coming as Lord of all the nations. We who have been  
redeemed by him,  
and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring you these gifts. Send your Holy  
Spirit upon us and upon this offering of your Church, that we who eat and drink at this holy table may share  
the divine life of Christ our Lord.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever.**  
Celebrant Pour out your Spirit upon the whole earth and make it your new creation.  
Gather your Church together from the ends of the earth into your kingdom, where  
peace and justice are revealed, that we, with all your people, of every language, race, and nation, may share  
the banquet you have promised; through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, all honour and  
glory are yours, creator of all.  
**All Glory to you for ever and ever. Amen.**

### **The Lord's Prayer**

Celebrant And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,  
**All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be**  
**done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as**  
**we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver**  
**us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory,**  
**for ever and ever. Amen.**

### **The Breaking of the Bread**

Celebrant We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world.

All **God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.**

### Communion

*Christians of all denominations are invited to receive Communion. Sidespeople will direct you to a place at the altar rail - those in the side aisle pews come forward first. Our bishops have requested that the practice of intinction (dipping the Communion wafer into the wine) be discontinued as unhygienic. If we receive in one kind (i.e. Communion wafer only or wine only) we have received the sacrament in full.*
