Land Acknowledgement

All Saints' Peterborough resides on the sacred land of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabeg, the first peoples of this land. We offer our respect to those ancestors who may be buried in this land. This sacred land is part of the Rice Lake Purchase, Treaty 20. All Saints' is committed to continued reconciliation with our Indigenous siblings, through continued education and the inclusion of readings from the First Nations Bible.

Liturgical Notes

- 1. In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in God as the ancient peoples of God.
- 2. Younger and Elder Testament. The traditional terms for the testaments 'Old' and 'New' have been changed to Elder and Younger. This has been done as an act of equity and promise. Old and New are words in our society that add value to things often anything that is old is considered less valuable than things that are new. In our Christian context the New Testament has replaced the Old Testament, which is not only an incorrect theology, but it has also tied to it ethnic value, and antisemitic tones. The words Elder and Younger are born out of equity, and the Younger Testament is born out of the Elder Testament.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

READING Isaiah 11:1-10, NRSV

> A reading from the Elder Testament and the writings of the prophet Isaiah. Then a shoot will sprout up from the stump of Jesse; from Jesse's roots, a branch will blossom: the Spirit of God will rest upon you—a spirit of

wisdom and understanding, a spirit of counsel and strength, a spirit of knowledge and the reverence for God. You will delight in obeying God, and you will not judge by appearances, or make decisions by hearsay. You will treat poor people with fairness and you will uphold the rights of the land's downtrodden. With a single word you will strike down tyrants; with your decrees you will execute evil people. Justice will be the belt around your around this your waste—faithfulness will guird you up.

Then the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and the leopard will lie down with the young goat; the calf and the lion cub will graze together, and a little child will lead them.

The cow will feed with the bear; their young will lie down together. The lion will eat hay like the ox. The baby will play next to the den of the cobra, and the toddler will dance over the viper's nest. There will be no harm, no destruction anywhere in my holy mountain; for as water fills the sea, so the land will be filled with the knowledge of God.

On that day, the Root of Jesse will serve as a symbol to the peoples of the world—nations will flock to you, and your home will be a place of honour. On that day, God will once more raise a hand to recover the remnant of what is left of the people, and gather them back from Assyria, Egypt, Pathros, Ethiopia, Elum, Shinar, Hamath, and the Islands of the sea.

Reading

Romans 15:4-13, First Nations Bible

A reading from the Younger Testament and the wisdom of the Indigenous ancestors who kept this land, from the ancient text of the letter to the Churches in Rome.

These words were written down long ago so we would learn from them. It is from the Sacred Teachings that we find the hope and strength we need to walk this road of life. I pray that the Great Spirit who walks beside you, keeping your steps firm, will help you walk together in steps with the Creator Sets Free (Jesus), the Chosen One. In this way you will speak with one voice, giving honour to the Great Spirit, the Creator of Creator Sets Free (Jesus). Our Honoured Chief, who is the Chosen One.

So, welcome each other with open arms in the same way the Chosen One has honored the Great Spirit by welcoming you. This is what I am saying: the Chosen One came as a servant to our Tribal People, to show that the Great Spirit has kept the promises made to our ancestors and also came to show kindness and mercy to the Outside Nations so that they would also give honour to the Great Spirit.

For the Sacred Teaching say, "I will tell the truth about you to all the Nations, I will sing songs to them to honour your name." They also say, "Dance for joy, all you Nations along with Creators people." And again,

"Give praise to the Great Spirit, all you Outside Nations. Let all people honour the Creator!" And again, the Prophet Creator Helps Us (Isaiah) says, "The one who is the root of the Original Man (Jesse) will rise up to rule over the Outside Nations, and they will put their hope and trust in him. My prayer for the Outside Nations is that the Great Spirit ,who gives you this hope, will fill you with the joy and peace that comes from trusting, so that this hope will flow like a river through your lives by the power of the Holy Spirit.

I tell you, God can raise children for Sarah and Abraham from these very stones!

Even now the axe is laid at the root of the tree. Every tree that is not fruitful will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I will baptize you in water if you have a change of heart, but the One who will follow me is more powerful

than I. I am not fit even to untie the sandals of the Coming One! That One will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and fire, whose winnowing-fan will clear the threshing floor. The grain will be gathered into the barn, but the chaff will be burned in an unquenchable fire.


