Please note: If we determine your child has any special needs that were **not** disclosed in the application form, you could be asked to withdraw your child from the program. If your child's behaviour is found to be continually disruptive or harmful to the program, to themselves, or to others, you could be asked to withdraw your child from the program. We try to make sure every child's needs are met so that they can enjoy camp, and we can usually do so with advanced notice!



Additional Camp Information

- Upon arriving at camp on the first day you will receive
 1. A trip consent form.
 2. A photo consent form
- On the first day of camp, you will be asked for the names(s) of the person(s) your child will be arriving and departing with. This person must be an adult or a sibling over the age of 15 years. Upon arrival, that person must sign your child in, thus placing him/her into the camp's care, and upon departure must sign your child out, thus removing him/her from the camp's care. Your child can only be released to a person whose name is on the list.
- We will be taking pictures of the children during camp days to be used for advertising purposes only. If you would prefer your child to not have their photo taken, please let us know immediately.
- Our church strives to be nut free. *NUT-FREE* snacks will be provided.
- Each day, your child should arrive at camp wearing sunscreen and a hat
- In your child's backpack please include the following items

LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME:

- a bottle of sunscreen for later application
 - an extra mask
 - hand sanitizer and wipes
 - a hat or cap
 - a water bottle to be re-filled throughout the day
 - a change of clothes in case of accidents or after water games
- Please make sure your child is dressed in preparation for both hot and cool weather and with appropriate footwear that they can run in. Please no flip flops or fancy dress up shoes that are difficult to run in.
- Things **not** to bring to camp include:
 - electronic devices (ipads, game systems, drones, cell phones, etc.)
 - toys (unless given permission)
 - Anything that might harm another child (nuts, pointy things, etc.)
 - Anything valuable that a child would be heartbroken to lose!

If your child becomes ill while at camp, you will be called first and then the emergency contact numbers will be contacted. If your child is injured while at camp, you will be contacted to come and decide upon medical treatment. If the injury is deemed serious, an ambulance will be called first and then you will be called to meet a staff person and your child at the hospital.
